OFFICIAL MINUTES

Council Meeting

Opening of the Council Meeting:

- 1. President Kenneth Hayes called the meeting to order at 10:30 A.M. and Recording Secretary Derrick Carr gave the invocation.
- 2. Recording Secretary Carr did the roll call; 31 members present and 4 absent. (See attached roll call sheet).

Collective Bargaining Recommendations:

The Council reviewed and discussed the major policy issues as dictated by the Local Constitution. President Hayes reminded the Council that since there will not be any contract negotiations this year; we will table the collective bargaining recommendations to a later date.

Goals of the Union:

President Hayes stated that the goals of the Union are for us to provide the best representation to our members and to ensure the financial stability of our Local Union. He then opened the floor for discussion on the goals of the Union. A lengthy dialogue ensued about the handling of grievances. The following highlights were noted:

- 1. Branch President Felandria Jackson raised the issue about Mail Handlers requesting a copy of the grievance file.
 - a) The position of the Local is that the grievance file is the property of the Union, which is based upon the language in article 15, of the National

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Agreement; in particular the language covering step 2 of the grievance procedure.

b) If necessary the Steward can allow the grievant to view the file; however, if they insist on obtaining a copy refer them to the Local office.

c) Whenever a grievant is allowed to view or given a copy of the grievance file upon instructions from the Local office, we must ensure that the grievant does not view or get a copy of witness statements or any materials that require confidentiality – just the grievance form.

d) We must ensure that the grievant is informed at every step of the grievance process and given a copy of the settlement when one is reached.

- 2. President Hayes stated that if a Mail Handler insists that there is a grievance when there isn't one; show them the provisions of the contract or other regulatory policies or handbooks to prove your point. If they are insistent that a grievance exist, then send them through the chain-of—command to get the answer. If there is doubt in your mind file the grievance and allow the grievance procedure to deal with the issue.
- 3. Mail Handlers should follow the chain-of-command before contacting the State Executive Board Member or the Local President. President Hayes stated that the Local Policy for Mail Handler complaints is for them to discuss the problem with the Branch President first and allow the Branch President an opportunity to resolve the issue. The Goals of the Union discussion was closed.

National Convention:

President Hayes tabled the discussion for determining the number of delegates to attend the National Convention since there will not be a Convention this year. He noted that the LIUNNA Convention will be held in 2011 and the National Postal Mail Handler's National Convention will be held in 2012.

Compensation:

Prior to discussing the compensation of officers, President Hayes gave a financial presentation providing the income, expenses, and budget of the Local Union; a lengthy question and answer period followed the financial presentation. The presentation included a discussion on the cost cutting measures that will come from the Local office, investments of Local Union funds, LM2 reporting requirements, Annual Affairs, and the factors that are negatively affecting the Local's income: the loss of revenue from the Mail Handler Health Plan and the decline in Union membership.

Branch President Charles Perdue along with several other Branch Presidents stated that it was their desire to ensure that the Council "would take care of our Stewards." This point was well noted.

After further discussion the Council recessed for lunch at 12:00 P.M. and reconvened at 1:30 P.M.

Compensation (Continued):

Branch President Orson Smith opened the discussion with a proposal for the by-laws that would affect the expenses of the Annual Affair. After a lengthy discussion the proposal was withdrawn.

After further discussion on the compensation of officers and Annual Affairs, and a meeting of the minds of Branch President Perdue, Branch President Robert Ricketts, and Branch President Gregory Hooker the following motion was made by Branch President Perdue and seconded by Branch President Ricketts:

Motion: To reduce the compensation of the Vice President, Recording Secretary, State Executive Board Members, all Branch Presidents, Chief Stewards, and Shop Stewards by 25% and to reduce the amount spent per Mail Handler for the Annual Affair by 20%.

After further discussion, a **friendly amendment** was made by Branch President Danny Mangan to reduce both the Compensation of officers mentioned above and the amount spent per Mail Handler for the Annual Affair by 20%, to be retroactive to January 1, 2010.

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Motion passed by majority vote. (See Roll Call Sheet).

Being no further business before the Council on the day, a motion was made by Branch President Charles Washington, seconded by Branch President Gerald Billings to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 5:00 P.M.
